In October 1975, 5 journalists covering the invasion of East Timor by the Indonesian Military were murdered by the invading troops. The Australian Government knew of this within hours of the deaths of the 5 journalist, yet kept it hidden for years and went along with the Indonesian excuse that they were killed in the cross fire on the day.

Shirley's husband Greg was one of those killed and has fought ever since to bring out the truth of what happened on that day, and so far unsuccessfully, to have the remains of Greg returned to Australia.

Shirley's story is of intriguing, fascinating and concerning to anyone who has an interest in East Timor and the events of that time.

We have the great pleasure of having Shirley as our guest speaker on the 15th January to tell her story, we would love to have your company on the night but spaces are limited so let us know as soon as possible.

Junior Rotary - A new Concept!!!!

Public Relations and membership are a constant with Rotary. Do we need a rethink in some of the names we use to increase the relevance of Rotary??

"Ask people, what is Interact? Most people (including some Rotarians) would not know what it is, because the name has <u>no</u> relevance to Rotary. If Interact was changed to "Junior Rotary" children and parents would be able to identify with that concept". What do members think??

When I first heard the name of <u>Interact</u>, I did not know what it was and then I found it was an attempt to engage high/secondary school students in the ways of Rotary and community service, with the hope that students would develop an interest in Rotary and continue on with involvement with Rotaract and then Rotary itself. Has this strategy worked? Probably Not.

Interact and Rotaract, whilst a worthy strategy, I believe, need to be revisited, both in benefits to young people and how to involve Rotarians as mentors.

Ideas for change are every Rotarians preserve. I like the way our club involves the pony club with our sausage sizzle. This is a two way opportunity. Gives our Rotarians a chance to meet the young members and for the young ones to see what Rotarians do. However, some times the parents come instead, but at least the pony club assist in earning the money we provide them from time to time. Rotarians can be catalysts for the community.

Rotary is a well-known name in most communities and has, I believe high credibility. Youth Exchange is just an example of Rotary credibility, where parents entrust their 16/17 year old children to us to travel the world to experience other cultures.

What do we really offer young people with Interact and Rotaract? Just a name change may help, but we need to look at benefits of the programme, as there are few Interact clubs in any District in Australia and not many Rotaract Clubs. Is this a lost opportunity for Rotary?

Putting it simply, it's about credibility of these Rotary programmes
